OISEAUX TRISTES

(SAD BIRDS)

In arranging an orchestral score of Ravel's famous "Oiseaux Tristes" (Sad Birds), one excessively difficult problem had to be solved. This composition is generally considered so typically a pianistic one that an orchestral score based entirely on the original piano version might seem almost an impossibility. Yet no one, on the other hand, would presume to make any radical changes in this marvelous piece of music. Realizing that the core of this difficulty consists in the 12/8 movement Ravel has employed in this composition, I have endeavored to find a solution which makes it really simple to play and yet does not alter a single note. The answer was found by using a 6/8 movement instead, which makes it possible for the composer's original rhythm to sound exactly the same. No part of the score is now technically difficult. When the members of the school orchestras grow used to the subtle harmonization, they will find that this arrangement is really easy to master.

In conclusion, it should be noted that the bars of the cadence between numbers 11 and 12, between the two signs \bigcirc - \bigcirc , may be omitted without trouble, if soloists of the necessary ability are not available. Because of the delicate construction of this composition the trombones were omitted from the score.
